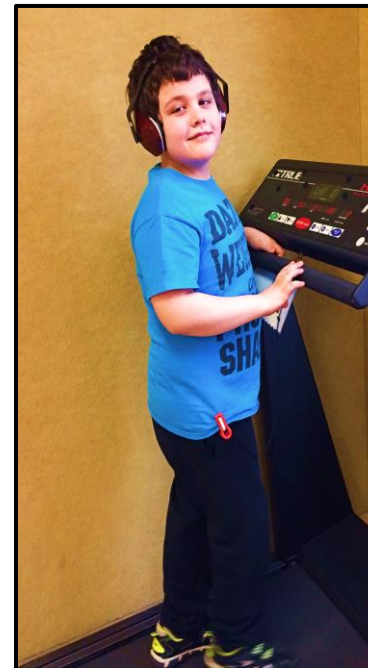

DID YOU KNOW...

- ◆ Children with cerebral palsy typically expend 2 to 3 times more energy than their peers when navigating school hallways!
- ◆ Regular aerobic exercise in children can expand their working memory—the capacity that allows them to mentally manipulate facts and ideas to solve problems—as well as improve their selective attention and their ability to inhibit disruptive impulses!
- ◆ The average toddler walks 2.6 miles per day!
- ◆ Around 200 muscles are required to take a step!
